- Read as many books and/or watch as many movies as I could. (T)
- Take a solo trip to visit all the wonders of the world or maybe just hike out somewhere near by. (C)
- Go on a mission trip. (S)

- ...seek out that one person who looks loneliest. (S)
- ...stand against the wall and wait for someone or something to spark your interest. (C)
- ...find some activity to do or head towards the snack bar. (T)
- ...meet and greet everyone you can. (R)

- *Anything using your mind powers* - Scientist, Engineer, Mathematician, Economics and Strategy (T)
- *Anything that physically heals people* - Nurse/Doctor, Therapist, Counselor, Police/Firefighter (S)

- *Anything with your hands* - Artist, Farmer, Baker, Candlestick Maker (C)

- *The social kind* - Dog, Cat, Song Bird, Pig or Horse (R)
- *The practical kind* - Sheep, Chickens, Donkey or Cow (S)
- *The exotic kind* - Rodent, Insect or Reptile (C)
