The 21st Sunday of Ordinary Time

FIRST READING (Is 22:19-23) SECOND READING (Rom 11:33-36) GOSPEL (Mt 16:13-20)

Virtues: Humility, Faith, Meekness, Honesty, Wisdom, Trust, Charity, Love, Obedience

Lessons: (1) The Cross, alone, stands as a fixed truth in a world that keeps on spinning.

- (2) No one can judge God's ways. He, alone, loves all, created all and knows all.
- (3) The only trustworthy testimony is God's: He gives His testimony to His Church.

FIRST READING (Jer 20:7-9) SECOND READING (Rom 12:1-2) GOSPEL (Mt 16:21-27)

Virtues: Love, Humility, Purity, Courage, Faith, Hope, Discipline, Charity, Obedience

Lessons: (1) Truth and goodness always speaks out/moves into action for love of neighbor.

- (2) Living for love (for God) is completely contrary to the teachings of the world.
- (3) Be very small before the Lord, so that He may be your only surety & strength.

Lessons: (1) If you refuse to save a person from death then you do not love.

- (2) Sinfulness is taking for yourself. Generosity and lending is love.
- (3) Humanity embraces God in their lives when they share with each other.

FIRST READING (Sir 27:30-28:9) SECOND READING (Rom 14:7-9) GOSPEL (Mt 18:21-35)

Virtues: Humility, Forgiveness, Love, Generosity, Joy, Obedience, Wisdom, Compassion

Lessons: (1) In order to be "with God", we must completely embrace God. God is love.

- (2) God who is the source and summit of our existence, is our only means of life.
- (3) Pursue only love and all evil will pass away in God's mercy and justice.

Lessons: (1) Reconcile with God while you can still discern good apart from evil.

(2) A soul who is truly in love with Jesus Christ is always happy to do good works.

(3) To act in love means to first celebrate good gifts and then give to others.

Virtues: Humility, Prudence, Honesty, Courage, Obedience, Thanksgiving, Love

Lessons: (1) Sin is the cause of our hardships and failure.

Virtue is the cause of our success and life.

- (2) Here on earth, we are meant to be the Church militant, a united front, submissively devoted to each other for the glory of God.

The 27th Sunday of Ordinary Time

FIRST READING (Is 5:1-7) SECOND READING (Phil 4:6-9) GOSPEL (Mt 21:33-43)

Virtues: Obedience, Trust, Righteousness, Love, Charity, Wisdom, Prudence, Wonder

Lessons:

- (1) You were made by love; your worthiness is love; you're made to live in love.
- (2) If you are too concerned about finding worldly sustenance, you will never find God's satiating gifts that will take care of you here, now, and forever, eternally.
- (3) If you are satisfied, in this world, you will not find righteousness and, in fact, you will lose everything you have while trying to cling to your satisfactions.

The 28th Sunday of Ordinary Time

FIRST READING (Is 25:6-10a) SECOND READING (Phil 4:12-14, 19-20) GOSPEL (Mt 22:1-14 or 22:1-10)

Virtues: Wisdom, Faith, Trust, Humility, Gratitude, Discipline, Charity, Love, Wonder

Lessons: (1) God gives people everything needed to thrive in total fulfillment at all times.

- (2) Circumstances can not define & control us when our friendship is with God.
- (3) God cannot help those who reject or disincline His invitations. But He can joyously help the poor who are willing and ready to respond in mutual love.

FIRST READING (Is 45:1, 4-6) SECOND READING (1 Thes 1:1-5b) GOSPEL (Mt 22:15-21)

Virtues: Love, Faith, Trust, Humility, Thanksgiving, Wisdom, Prudence, Meekness

Lessons:

- (1) God alone is love: completely honest, completely trustworthy, always giving.
- (2) To acquire an attitude of thankfulness, we must first recognize that everything we have is a gift freely and lovingly given to us by God.
- (3) Happiness and peace come from giving away your gifts to the people to whom they are owed: being rightly justified in your love and trust of God.

Virtues: Love, Compassion, Humility, Charity, Forgiveness, Contrition, Joy, Confidence

Lessons: (1) The Lord is first mercy and wants mercy. Justice belongs to Him who is perfect.

(2) The vibrancy of the Spirit's good works is proof of the Gospel proclamation.

(3) "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment.

The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.

The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments."

(3) True love of God and neighbor inspirits compassion and good works.

- (2) True and lasting confidence is rooted in having faith in the mercy of Christ.
- (3) God asks us to be prepared for His coming, today and for the life to come.

Virtues: Fear of God, Humility, Thanksgiving, Compassion, Charity, Faith, Love, Mercy

Lessons: (1) Our time in this world is drudgery and we should not expect more.
